



CAMPGROUND GENERAL POLICIES

- We want everyone to enjoy their stay at Trans Cascadia Excursions Campground. With that in mind, please follow our guidelines to basic Campground Etiquette (Attached)
- Generators are not permitted at the Trans Cascadia Excursions Campground
- Although we think sticks, bugs, rocks and fellow campers offer plenty of entertainment, you may want to listen to music or watch outdoor TVs at your site. Please keep in mind that your neighbors may not want to listen in, so keep programming and volume appropriate so that it does not disturb neighboring campers. We also ask that you not play music or videos in any of the communal areas.
- Our quiet hours are from 10:00 PM to 8:00 AM. Please limit sound and light to your own site during this time. This can be really hard for city dwellers who are accustomed to a lot of ambient noise and light. Seriously, you may have to whisper to keep your voice quiet at night. We strictly enforce these hours so all campers can enjoy their stay.
- If you have a reservation, you may arrive and check – in between 3pm and 10pm. Check – out is 11am. Please plan your travels accordingly so you’re not disappointed if we can’t accommodate you early or late.
- Please only setup shop on the site you reserve. All of our sites are individually booked so you can choose the spot that works best for you. But that means you have to stick to the site you book unless we can accommodate you otherwise upon arrival.
- You’re coming camping in nature. There are trees, bugs, plants, heat, smoke, rain, sun, wind, pollen and a whole host of other natural phenomena that we can’t control. It might be hot...or cold...or both. Use your best judgment to weigh the awesome benefits of being outside here vs. the possible close encounters of the natural kind you might experience. Be prepared and take into account our Cancellation and Change policies as you plan your adventure.
- Although we’re proud of the place we have created and think everyone will have a great time, we do reserve the right to refuse service to anyone and will not be responsible for accidents, injuries or loss of property of any kind. Keep your stuff secure, be aware of your environment,

and be a good steward of the forest. By making this reservation you acknowledge and agree to these terms.

FIRE

- NO BURNING FIRES – Only use Propane Fire Pits.
- No Charcoal Grills – Only propane cooking equipment is allowed.
- Smoking only allowed in designated areas
- The Trans Cascadia Excursions Campground during summer months, is in a high fire danger area. Please be fire conscious when visiting the campground and check in with the local United States Forest Service Ranger Station for up to date Fire Danger Level Info which can be found at this link: <https://www.fs.usda.gov/main/willamette/fire>
- Our community has been severely affected by fire in the past, we appreciate your strict adherence to our no fire policy.

DOGS

- Please be a responsible pet owner while visiting the Trans Cascadia Excursions Campground.
- Friendly dogs may stay for \$5 per night, per pet with a max of 2 dogs.
- Dogs must be leashed or in an enclosure at all times. Dogs may not be left alone.
- Campers must clean up after your dog. We will ask careless owners to leave.
- We will ask owners with aggressive or excessively loud animals to leave without refund.

SMOKING

- You may smoke in the designated smoking areas.

Campground Etiquette



Be mindful of your noise level.

Our community and your camping neighbor appreciate your consideration.



Be respectful during quiet hours.

Quiet hours are 10pm - 8am. Be considerate of other campers and our neighbors. Keep voices low, children and dogs quiet, and music off.



Be aware of your night lights.

Keep outdoor lighting to a minimum during quiet hours. Use flashlights and not car headlights while setting up camp.



Stay on trails.

Be conscious of other campers' space. Walk on designated trails and campground roads only. If you camp with children, please remind them of this.



Fire Safety

Propane fire and cooking equipment only. Smoking is allowed in designated areas only.



Keep your dog calm and secured.

Keep your dogs on a leash and in your control at all times. Please clean up after your dog.



Keep a tidy campsite.

Leaving food out and unattended will invite wildlife to join you. Please store all food in your vehicle when not preparing or eating meals.



Wash dishes at designated dish washing stations.

Water spigots are a source for fresh water. Keep them clean and free of food and soaps.



Take only memories, leave only footprints.

Leave your campsite and communal spaces better than you found them.



Drive 5mph inside the campground. ALWAYS!

Be aware of children that may not be paying attention.
