

Daylight Saving Time ends on Sunday, November 5 at 2:00 a.m.



Stormwater: Where It Flows, Everything Goes

Stormwater is generated from water that falls from the sky, including rain, hail, and snow. As stormwater flows over driveways, lawns, and sidewalks, it picks up debris, chemicals, dirt, and other pollutants.

In most cases, everything that enters a stormwater system is carried *untreated* into water that we use for swimming, fishing, and drinking. Untreated polluted water has a direct impact on our waterways.



- Resist the temptation to leave dog waste to the elements—bag it and bin it. Pet waste contains phosphorus, nitrogen and harmful bacteria.
- Check your car and lawn equipment for leaks. A good rainstorm can send gasoline and oil drips from automobiles, lawnmowers and power equipment into our waterways.
- Use a commercial car wash or wash your car on a lawn or other unpaved surface to minimize the amount of dirty, soapy water flowing into the storm drain and eventually into our river.
- ☑ Use pesticides and fertilizers sparingly. When use is necessary, use these chemicals in the recommended amounts. Avoid application if the forecast calls for rain; otherwise, chemicals will be washed into our waterways.

After a Delayed Start Backyard Burn Season is Open

Please be sure to purchase your 2023–2024 burn permit at City Hall for \$6, or \$3 for seniors.

ALWAYS call LRAPA before you burn:

541-726-3976 (press 5 for Westfir)

Only burn dry, woody yard debris. LRAPA permit required for tree removal and slash burns. **No burning of building materials, plastic, hazardous waste or household garbage. No burn barrels.**

Illegal burning is subject to fines of \$50 to \$250.

Senior Meals Café 60 Dining Room
